
## **Tobacco Retailers in Jackson, MS**

The Jackson Metro Statistical Area consists of three counties:



Hinds County, compared to neighboring Rankin and Madison counties, has a higher % of Black residents and a higher % of residents who fall below the federal poverty line.

It is easier for a Hinds county resident to encounter a tobacco retailer. Hinds County's tobacco retailer density is 1.7 and 1.2 times higher than the adjacent counties.

How many tobacco retailers are there per 10,000 individuals?

## **Tobacco Retailer Density Explained**

Retailer density is calculated by counting the number of retailers within each county divided by the total population. Here it is represented as Retailers per 10,000 individuals. Tobacco Retailer locations were retrieved from the Mississippi Business Database by filtering for NAICS codes that were likely tobacco retailers. Demographic data is from the US Census and retrieved from ESRI.





## **Tobacco Retailers and Schools in Jackson, MS**


Tobacco retailer density doesn't just affect adults. Mississippi currently does not have any legislation on the books regarding proximity of retailers to schools. Research has shown that regulating proximity and density of retailers to schools can help reduce adolescent smoking initiation.

In Hinds County, students at 80% of schools can walk to a tobacco retailer (within 1 mile); 13% of schools are within 1000 feet of the nearest retailer.
